Introduction

Welcome to the first Progress Report of the Van der Filk convention. Only a couple more of these things to write after this one, and that means only a couple more for you to read and then there will be het boek van programmering (or in English the Programme Book) which you will be able to ignore as usual and enjoy the con.

Why "Van der Filk"? We had originally intended to exploit French numbers to contrive a suitable pun for the name, and mount the whole convention in the back of a Ford Transit van which would spend the whole convention weekend driving along the French autoroutes, thus saving hotel function space and campsite costs, and guaranteeing there'd always be something new and interesting to look at out of the windows if you got bored with the music... But then we added up the hire cost of the string of 97 caravans for accomodation, plus fuel for 100 vehicles (that's including the flatbed carrying the two portaloos, and the hot dog van), plus the cost of carbon credits to offset our footprint, plus the sheer damn fiddliness of setting up rope bridges between all those moving vehicles so people could get about... and it all started to look a little bit impractical. Gwen Knighton Raftery discovered filk at DragonCon 2000 when a pal dragged her to the filk room saying, "You're really gonna love this stuff." There she was invited to a pagan gathering by the Suttons where they instantly assimilated her and her harps into the band, *Year and a Day*. Weekly lyric rehearsals attended only by the women of the group evolved into the trio *Three Weird Sisters*. In addition to two CDs with TWS (*Rite the First Time* and *Hair of the Frog*), Gwen has a solo CD (*Box of Fairies* -- so named as an explanation to a clueless person who wanted to know where all the pretty music comes from.)

Gwen met Joe Raftery at the Sutton annual New Year's party. It sounds clichè, but it was love at first sight. Gwen packed up harps and household and, with young son Gavin, moved to London, and then almost immediately to Singapore for a year. Upon returning to the UK with an extensive acquired knowledge of oriental cooking, Joe and Gwen married in a Renaissance wedding at the British filk con in 2006. The happy couple set up household in London. Gwen is a caring, creative, determined person who, when she puts her will to it, can do just about anything. Having been performing together since 2005--only a few short years; only the better part of forever--Michelle "Vixy" Dockrey and Tony Fabris are two halves of a perfect musical whole. Creative, charming, sweet,

endearing office mouse meets debonair, precise, practiced, methodical code monkey, and a beautiful thing is born. Life is a constant zoo day with Vixy and Tony around, and we mean that in the very best of ways. Between the two of them, they dabble in almost every artistic endeavour you can name, and master more than a few.

Vixy first came to filk as part of the trio Escape Key, and one of her very first well-known songs, "The Girl That's Never Been," went on to win a Pegasus Award.
